

## SECOND DAY: THE DAY OF THE MUSEUMS

Another zone that we visited on the next day is the zone of the port with a **Rådhus** or really peculiar **City council**, all plenty of sculptures and reliefs. Next we found the **Akker Brygge**, zone of leisure and commerce, with many people walking, and, to the other side, the strength and the castle of **Akershus**.

We have bought an **Oslo Card Pass 24h** that gives to access to all the public transport and all, yes, all the museums in a free way. It compensates vastly.

We visit the **Peninsula of Bygdøy**, with many museums, some of them very interesting. The museum of the villages or **Norks Folkemuseum**, really charming and very recommendable, with a representation of houses of all the country. The **Frammuseet**, with an Arctic boat, not too interesting. **Kon-Tikimuseum** with two representative boats.

We return to eat. We have a problem with the meals in just a short time that we took here. The prices are very lifted and everything is fastfoods of North American multinationals.

In the evening we go to the **Vigelandsparken**. A park wonder, pity bad weather that accompanies to us. It is all plenty of statues and allegorical human figures of **Gustav Vigeland**. A magnificent source and, finally, in all the stop, a monolith of twenty meters of height in granite of a single piece.

We spend the night to the port.
