

To get to the **Reichenbach** waterfall you must go with the **rack railway**. A nice ride on a centenary train. When we arrived at the base of the cascade we see, on the other hand, a man with an **Alp horn**, that despite the noise of the falling water, plays a song with that curious **wooden** instrument. Formerly it was used as an instrument of communication in the Alps although this theory is not too clear as its origin.
